### 第一天: 新加坡-名古屋 (机上用餐)

今晚, 您将齐聚新加坡樟宜国际机场乘坐您所选择的客机前往名古屋。

### 第二天: 名古屋-京都-大阪 (早/午/晚餐)

【嵯峨野竹林】嵯峨野竹林位于日本京都的国家指定古迹——岚山。竹林小径长约500米, 从竹林中穿过, 你可以听到风吹过竹叶发出的天籁之音, 这一声音也被评为日本100种最值得保留的声音之一。

【渡月桥】是岚山的标志性景观, 保留着木造结构的桥身与背后树木繁茂的群山构成一幅美不胜收的山水画卷

【伏见稻荷大社】深受京都人爱戴的神社之一, 也是京都最古老的神社之一。

### 第三天: 大阪-姬路-冈山 (早/午/晚餐)

【姬路城】一般认为是日本最壮丽的城堡之一, 由于其外墙刷成白色, 而造型又像白鹭, 故又称为白鹭城

【后乐园】它是日本最美丽的三大名园之一, 也是世界文化遗产之一。到现在已经有300年的历史, 是一片山水如画的庭院, 去的人却大多是远道的游客。江户时代的冈山的藩主池田一家很重视耕战, 不仅为后世留下了大量的良田, 也留下了美丽的后乐园。

【仓敷美观地区运河仓敷川】是为了运送货物所兴建, 你可以欣赏两岸的柳树垂荫, 以及江户时代保存至今的建筑—以前为商家与仓库, 如今改建为博物馆、餐厅、商店等。



### 第四天: 冈山-香川-德岛-高知

(早/午/晚餐)

【栗林公园】江户时代初期到中期, 这里曾是全日本最著名的『回游式大名庭』。

【祖谷的蔓桥】是三条桥中最大和最有名, 桥长45米, 离河谷14米。每隔三年便会重建, 两端固定在高大的雪松树, 钢索隐藏在藤蔓中以确保安全, 游客只能向单方面行走。

【大步危峡谷 (含峡谷游览船)】能够近距离欣赏大步危峡谷美丽景色的“大步危峡谷游览船”上, 可一边听着老船夫的讲解, 一边欣赏眼前延展开来的绝佳景致。



### 第五天: 高知-德岛-淡路 (早/午餐)

【高知城】是一座日本城堡。是平山形的城堡, 日本国家指定遗迹之一。高知城内的天守阁是日本保存最为完好的12座城堡之一。

【竹林寺】竹林寺是位于高知县的寺院, 是四国灵场第31号札所(朝山拜庙者领取护身符的地方)。

【播磨屋购物街】步行街  
今晚您将入住温泉酒店。

### 第六天: 淡路-神户-大阪 (早/午餐)

【鸣门“涡潮” (包含游船游览)】涡潮就是海洋涨潮落潮相互作用, 最后在海面上产生的大规模漩涡, 很壮观。

【明石海峡大桥 (拍照留念)】此桥在1998年建成, 它是世界上目前最长的吊桥。

【心斋桥】琳琅满目各式新潮的物品, 之后前往道顿街品尝让日本人难以忘怀的大阪风味美食。

### Day 1: Singapore → Nagoya (MOB)

Tonight, assemble at Singapore Changi Airport for your flight to the land of the rising sun - Japan.

### Day 2: Nagoya - Kyoto - Osaka (B/L/D)

**Arashiyama Bamboo Grove**, the walking paths that cut through the bamboo groves make for a nice walk. They are particularly attractive when there is a light wind and the tall bamboo stalks sway gently back and forth.

**Togetsukyo Bridge**, Arashiyama's most iconic landmark. It was originally built during the Heian Period (794-1185) and most recently reconstructed in the 1930s. The bridge looks particularly attractive in combination with the forested mountainside in the background.

**Fushimi Inari Shrine**, is an important Shinto shrine in southern Kyoto. It is famous for its thousands of vermilion torii gates, which straddle a network of trails behind its main buildings. The trails lead into the wooded forest of the sacred Mount Inari, which stands at 233 meters and belongs to the shrine grounds.

### Day 3: Osaka - Himeji - Okayama (B/L/D)

**Himeji Castle**, also known as White Heron Castle due to its elegant, white appearance, is widely considered as Japan's most spectacular castle for its imposing size and beauty and its well preserved, complex castle grounds. The castle is both a national treasure and a world heritage site.

**Korakuen**, is a beautiful landscape garden and Okayama's main attraction. Korakuen is ranked as one of Japan's three best landscape gardens. It is located just beside Okayama Castle, which can be seen from the garden as "borrowed scenery".

**Kurashiki Canal area** - During the Edo Period (1603-1867), Kurashiki was an important point along the distribution route of Japan's most important commodity, rice. Canals were built to allow boats and barges to navigate between the city's storehouses and the nearby port. A central section of the city's former canal system has been preserved in the Bikan Historical Quarter.

### Day 4: Okayama - Kagawa - Tokushima - Kochi (B/L/D)

**Kagawa Ritsurin Koen**, is a landscape garden in Takamatsu City, built by the local feudal lords during the early Edo Period. Considered one of the best gardens in Japan, it is often suggested that Ritsurin Koen deserves a spot on the list of the "three most beautiful gardens of Japan".

**Kazurabashi Bridge of Iya Valley**, the largest and most popular of the remaining bridges, stretches 45 meters across the Iya River at the center of the valley, and gives visitors an unsettling view of the water 14 meters below the open slats of the span. It can be crossed in one direction only.

**Oboke Gorge**, mean "big dangerous steps", are narrow, steep sided gorges near the entrance to the Iya Valley and popularly combined with a visit there. Here you will take the **Oboke Sightseeing Boat Cruise**, riding down the Yoshino River, guides point out interesting rocks, many of which resemble different animals, along the way.

### Day 5: Kochi - Tokushima - Awaji (B/L)

**Kochi Castle**, the castle used to be the seat of the Yamauchi lords, who ruled over the surrounding region, then known as Tosa, during the Edo Period. It is one of just twelve Japanese castles to have survived the fires, wars and other catastrophes of the post feudal age.

**Chikurinji Temple**, on Godaisan, which has since become an important stop on the Shikoku Pilgrimage. Number 31 of the 88 temples along

the pilgrimage, Chikurinji attracts pilgrims as well as students because of its reputation as a scholastic institution.

**Kochi Harimayabashi Downtown shopping**, the famous landmark of Kochi's downtown is Harimayabashi, a small red bridge on the west side of the main street. In addition to Harimayabashi, downtown Kochi has pedestrian shopping arcades and attractive streets for walking.

### Day 6: Awaji - Kobe - Osaka (B/L)

**The Naruto whirlpools (include Cruise ride)**, occur along the Shikoku coast of the Naruto Strait, and are created by the large volumes of water moving between the Seto Inland Sea and the Pacific Ocean between high and low tide, combined with the unique underwater geography of the narrow strait.

**The Akashi Kaikyo Bridge (photo-taking)**, with a length of almost four kilometers, is the world's longest suspension bridge.

**Shinsaibashi**, is a popular shopping district in Osaka which has a long history as a regional center of commerce. Shop till you drop at Dotonbori Shopping.

### Day 7: Osaka → Singapore (B)

After breakfast, you shall bid farewell to this beautiful country as you will be transferred to the airport for your flight back to Singapore.
